Case Example: Mother and Child

Boyd: Mom! My arm's bleeding!
Mother: What happened?
Boyd: I fell!
Mother: Well, you were going too fast. You were rushing and -

Mother: Boyd! Stop! [sighs] See? It's just a scratch. It's not a big deal.
Boyd: I can't go to school. It's still bleeding!
Mother: Of course you can go to school. Don't be ridiculous, okay? Listen, honey, I have to finish cleaning up around here; I have to finish your lunch, so I need you to put your shoes on, get your backpack on, and stop this, okay? You are fine. It is just a scratch. Do you want a band-aid?
